



Co-Pilot Communications Challenge Mission Briefing

Mission Overview:

After a crash course in dog fighting with a CF-18 Hornet jet fighter, including pre mission practice and briefing along with a live session of dog fighting, it is time for the communications challenge exercise. The exercise involves having participants in the simulators flying without any cockpit instrumentation turned on. All the information necessary for them to fly their mission must be communicated to them by their co-pilot in the tower where they have a full display of the aircrafts instruments. Several rounds of combat are undertaken with the group switching roles between pilot and co-pilot each round. Between rounds the group discusses the challenges of communicating in the high pressure environment of combat. Parallels to the work place are made to relate their discoveries about effective communication to their real world roles.



Execution Details:

- Initial welcome, event mission briefing and creation of flight squads
- Hornet skills development session on PC simulators and pre-mission briefing for each flight squad
- Initial familiarization flight in CF-18 simulators, including head to head combat for each flight squad
- Once all pilots have completed their familiarization flight, the Co-Pilot Communications challenge will begin. Pilots will be briefed on the competition and the initial order will be set.



- After the communications exercise a round robin style competition is held to lighten things up and have some fun together as a team. 4 pilots climb aboard the simulators and the competition begins. Once a pilot has been "downed" they hand their plane to the next pilot in line. Pilots continue to compete and rotate in and out of the simulators for the remainder of the event. While pilots are awaiting their next hop in the simulator they are encouraged to help coach those that are

flying to help them perform like an ace! While this event still has its roots in excitement and solid competition, it's the pilots that have the most fun that win.

Standard Mission Supplies Included:

- Air Combat Mission for each person: 15min. PC simulator training session, 15 min pre-mission briefing & 30min Hornet combat simulator mission
- Co-Pilot Communication Exercise as laid out above
- Round Robin Challenge: cycle pilots through sim's flying live action head-to-head air combat!
- Use of events room during missions.
- Refreshments (pop, juice and water) and Snack bowls (chips, party mixes and nuts).
- Framed Award and Participation certificates.
- Pilot Callsign Nametags.
